

TODAY'S GOSPEL: LUKE 17:20-18:14

And he told them a parable, to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor regarded man: and there was a widow in that city who kept coming to him and saying, 'Vindicate me against my adversary.' For a while he refused; but afterward he said to himself, 'Though I neither fear God nor regard man, yet because this widow bothers me, I will vindicate her, or she will wear me out by her continual coming."' And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will vindicate them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?

He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and despised others: "Two men went up into the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I get.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but he who humbles himself will be exalted."

THE WAYS OF OUR GREAT LENTEN JOURNEY Part III

Jesus said, "Be as perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect." He asks us to strive to improve our failings, open our hearts and minds to enjoy the loving presence of God. The Great Lenten season in the Armenian Church is for the improvement of our spiritual life, the strengthening of our faith and reconciliation with God and with each other that becomes broken by our imperfect humanity.

Deprived of Holy Communion - The abstaining from receiving Holy Communion is a self-imposed Lenten practice. Nowhere in our church canon or tradition is Holy Communion ever refused, nor should it be. When the practice of the Closed *Badarak* became a tradition, naturally it was difficult to administer Holy Communion to the faithful because the Altar Curtain was closed. And so it has become practice not to receive Holy Communion during our season of renewal and spiritual growth.

Nonetheless, Holy Communion can be received always. Should any faithful person desire Holy Communion even during the Great Lenten season, particularly if there is a physical illness or if a long journey is to be taken. This has been customary and Holy Communion may be received after the Sunday form of Lenten *Badarak* is completed. Arrangement with the pastor should be made before that day.

Quiet and Silent Sanctuary at the end of worship with no music as we leave reminds us that in silence we should listen as we leave for the echo of Christ's voice be as perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect.

With these changes in worship, we look for what was the Paradise we had, and with hope and patience we wait to restore, reconcile, rejoin, and renew our place with Jesus our Saviour at the conclusion of Great Lent, that is Our Lord's Resurrection; that is as well the beginning of our eternity in the Kingdom.

WE HAVE RECEIVED A DIRECTIVE AND APPEAL FROM OUR PRIMATE, ARCHBISHOP KHAJAG AS FOLLOWS:

About the Prayer of Manasseh

Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign; he reigned 55 years in Jerusalem [from 698-642 BCE]. He did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, according to the abominable practices of the nations whom the LORD drove out before the people of Israel.

Manasseh misled Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that they did more evil than the nations whom the LORD had destroyed before the people of Israel. The LORD spoke to Manasseh and his people, but they gave no heed. Therefore, the LORD brought against them the commanders of the army of the king of Assyria, who took Manasseh captive in manacles, bound him with fetters, and brought him to Babylon.

While he was in distress, he entreated the favor of the LORD his God, and humbled himself greatly before the God of his ancestors. He prayed to him, and God received his entreaty, heard his plea, and restored him again to Jerusalem and to his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD indeed was God.

He took away the foreign gods and the idol from the house of the LORD, and all the altars that he had built on the mountain of the house of the LORD and in Jerusalem, and he threw them out of the city. He also repaired the altar of the LORD, and offered on it sacrifices of well-being and of thanksgiving and he commanded Judah to serve the LORD the God of Israel.

[2 Chronicles 33:1-2, 9-13, & 15-16]

In the Armenian Orthodox Church the Prayer of Manasseh is offered during Great Lent as a constant reminder of the need to ask for forgiveness and to know that when it is done with a sincere, open and honest heart and spirit, God our Heavenly Father will open his arms to embrace and receive anyone who turns back to him from the most evil of ways.

The Prayer of Manasseh is a short work of fifteen verses of the penitential prayer of the Judean king Manasseh. He is recorded in the Bible as one of the most idolatrous. However, after having been taken captive by the Assyrians, he prays for mercy and turns from his idolatrous ways.

And so, we are reminded that it is not uncommon for us to call out to God for help when troubles seem to overpower us, and then to forget our promises to God when everything returns to normal. This prayer during Great Lent keeps us on the straight path to his mercy.

The Prayer of Manasseh is included in certain editions of the Greek Septuagint; for example, the fifth century Codex Alexandrinus includes the prayer among fourteen Odes appearing just after the Psalms. As the Greek and Syriac languages served as the basis for the Armenian Canon of the Bible, it therefore has always been a part of our Holy Scripture. It was later printed in the 1599 Geneva Bible and then in the Latin Vulgate, and even later in the King James Bible. Currently, it is considered apocryphal by Catholics, Jews and Protestants alike; meaning that it was added later. The Orthodox accept it as a Deuterocanonical book (not part of the original Hebrew Bible.) It also is printed in Old Slavonic, Ethiopic, and Syriac translations.

- The altar curtain is closed
- There is no Kiss of Peace during the Divine Liturgy
- Holy Communion is not offered during the Divine Liturgy
- The Holy Gospels Book is not venerated after worship
- •Hymns are sung in penitential melody
- •Names of saints are not remembered during the week
- The organ is not played when you depart from the sanctuary
- •All should remain silent when exiting the sanctuary after worship in respect to those who remain for devotional prayers
- Weddings and Baptisms are not celebrated
