MEN'S SOCIETY PANCAKE BREAKFAST FEATURING EGGS AND BASTURMA

WHY THIS WEEK IS WITHOUT SCRIPTURE READINGS By Fr. Daniel Findikyan Dean of St. Nersess Armenian Seminary

This week—Monday, January 25 through Friday, January 29—is a fasting period known as *Arachavorats Bahk* or "The Preliminary Fast." This five-day fasting period in the Armenian Church begins on the tenth Monday before Easter and lasts until the Friday of that week. Great Lent begins three weeks later on the seventh Monday before Easter. Of all the days in the Armenian liturgical year, only the days of the *Arachavorats Bahk* have no scripture readings appointed to be read during the daily services.

The word "Arachavorats" comes from two root words: arach (before) and avoor (day). So the literal translation would be something like "preceding days." In English it is best referred to as the "Preliminary Fast," in other words, the fast that precedes the Great Fast, Great Lent.

Many eastern churches have a similar fast that falls some time before Great Lent and serves as a means of easing gradually into the rigors of Great Lent. These pre-Lenten fasts developed in many areas around the seventh century.

The eighth century Armenian theologian Grigoris Arsharuni developed a highly allegorical interpretation for the fast: the five days without readings symbolize the five patriarchs—Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham and Isaac—who were justified previous to the Law of Moses.

The reason there are no Bible readings during this time has to do with the popularity of Grigoris' allegorical interpretation. In the eighth century, when Grigoris wrote about *Arachavorats*, there were many days in the Armenian liturgical calendar that still did not have scripture readings assigned. Evidently, Grigoris' interpretation was considered so authoritative that the church never appointed readings for those days until today, while every other day of the year acquired readings.

A further note on this week in the calendar: The Friday of *Arachavorats* is the Commemoration of the Prophet Jonah, the only saint whom the Armenian Church commemorates on a Friday, otherwise considered a penitential day. In the Armenian Church (unlike other churches) saints can only be commemorated on Mondays, Tuesday, Thursdays and Saturdays. It is possible that Jonah was assigned to a Friday (and the Friday of a fasting week) because of the highly penitential character of the Book of Jonah, especially Jonah's powerful penitential prayer from the belly of the fish (Jonah 2:3-9). We would all do well to offer it in prayer this Friday.
