

# The Prophet Elijah

The magnificent life of Elijah, the great prophet of the Old Testament, is recorded for us in I and II Kings. He was a real but almost legendary figure, like St. John the Baptist: hairy, dressed in animal skins, coming out of the wilderness to terrify the whole country with his announcements of impending calamity, and then disappearing. Elijah, being the greatest among the prophets, is commemorated on a Sunday. He appeared at the Transfiguration as the prophet of "life" and the new covenant, as distinguished from Moses and the old covenant. Most importantly, Elijah did not experience death, but was taken to heaven; hence like the Mother-of-God, Elijah was counted among the heavenly. Elijah is a highly beloved and cherished Prophet-Saint of the Armenians, as well as all the Eastern Churches, and is held in highest esteem of all the saints in the Old Testament (2003 Domar).

# Sts. Hripsimeh and Gayane

Monday, June 12th and Tuesday, June 13th, Saints Hripsimeh and Gayane are remembered by the Armenian Church along with a group of 37 young maidens because of their persecution, which resulted from their refusal to renounce their Christian faith. The pagan Armenian king, Drtad, infuriated that the virgins would not consent to his desires, subjected Hripsimeh and Gayane and their followers to the most horrible tortures. St. Gregory, upon the conversion of Armenia to Christianity, built chapels over the relics of Hripsimeh and Gayane, which were later re-constructed into beautiful cathedrals. The Armenian Church recognizes Hripsimeh and Gayane as Saints, because their martyrdom was a major contribution to the eventual conversion of Armenia to Christianity.
