TODAY'S GOSPEL: Matthew 22:34-23:39

But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they came together. And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question, to test him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your god with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets."

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them a question, saying, "What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David, inspired by the Spirit, calls him Lord, saying, 'The Lord said to my Lord, sit at my right hand, till I put your enemies under your feet?' If David thus calls him Lord, how is he his son?" And no one was able to answer him a word, nor from that day did any one dare to ask him any more questions.

Then said Jesus to the crowds and to his disciples, "The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat; so practice and observe whatever they tell you, but not what they do; for they preach, but do not practice. They bind heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with their finger. They do all their deeds to be seen by men; for they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long, and they love the place of honor at feasts and the best seats in the synagogues, and salutations in the market places, and being called rabbi by men. But you are not to be called rabbi, for you have one teacher, and you are all brethren. And call no man your father on earth, for you have one Father, who is in heaven. Neither be called masters, for you have one master, the Christ. He who is greatest among you shall be your servant; whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted.

THE SIXTH WEEK OF GREAT LENT

SUNDAY OF THE ADVENT

Prayer and Gratitude

We give thanks to you, O Lord our God, who with your visible light gladdens all your creatures, and with the knowable light of your commandments, you have enlightened all those who believe in you. Strengthen us also, O Lord, during this day and at all times, so that with enlightened minds, we may always do that which is pleasing to you, and may arrive at those good things which are to come, along with your saints. Through the grace and mercy of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

This Sunday is dedicated not only to the Second Coming of Christ but also to His Birth and Incarnation, that is, God **becoming** Jesus, fully God and fully human. He will come again, this time not as a gentle and lowly Savior, but as a righteous judge in the glory of His Father with a retinue of angels. He will sift through the good and the evil just as a shepherd separates the sheep and the goats at day's end. At each Divine Liturgy (Badarak), we proclaim in the Creed (Havadamk) that He will come "to judge the living and the dead." As Jesus clearly states, we will be judged for all the acts of righteous goodness we have performed. Did we feed the hungry, console those in need of comfort, ease suffering, heal a broken heart? Only on this unequivocal basis will we be received into God's Kingdom and Eternal Life.

Read: Matthew 24: 30-31

Do: Call a neighbor, offer a visit, deliver a baked treat for them to enjoy. **Reflect or discuss as family:** What are some ways we have loved our neighbors during these last weeks of the Lenten season? What can we continue to do so that the gifts of the Great Fast / *Medz Bahk* become woven into the very fabric of our daily lives 24/7, 1/365?

GETTING READY FOR EASTER SUNDAY DINNER

Traditionally the beauty and main food item for the Easter dinner are red colored eggs. The color is significant and the so is the egg. The egg is a microcosm of the world, Saint Gregory of Datev comments. He allegorizes the shell to be akin to the light of the sky, the membrane to the air, the white to signify water and the yolk is the earth, all important to sustain life. Also, the egg is a symbol of the tomb of Jesus from which He Rose to Life again.

Dyeing eggs red is the Armenian and Orthodox custom, unlike pastel shades or other colors of the rainbow. Why red? It tells us that Christ shed His red Blood for the salvation of the world and as we take the red colored egg in our hands we declare that our salvation is in Christ who rose from the tomb to heaven where we will follow him.

There is a fun tradition often referred to as "Tak-A-Took" or the egg fight, wherein one tries to crack the egg of an opponent. It is fun for both adults and children alike. Of course, we should remember why we are cracking each other's eggs on Easter, and we should declare the Easter Greeting with each attempt.

The person who hits the egg of another person who is holding an egg says: Christ is Risen—Krisdos Haryav ee Merelots. The person holding an egg answers: Blessed is the Resurrection of Christ—Orhnial eh Harootiunn Krisdosee.

NEXT SUNDAY-TRNPATSEK / OPENING OF THE DOORS

On Palm Sunday, we remember our Lord's glorious entry into the Holy City of Jerusalem. In observance of this feast day, the Armenian Church conducts a special ceremony—TRNPATSEK. It is normally held at sundown at Vespers. Most U.S. parishes conduct this service at noon because people do not attend Evening Prayer. At St. John, TRNPATSEK will take place at 9:30 am in the lobby at the doors to the temple – DAJAR— just prior to the Palm Sunday Badarak. The ceremony is symbolic of Jesus' Second Coming / Advent and the Last Judgement. The priest kneels before the closed doors to God's House, knocking, requesting entry into His Kingdom. All present hear the knock and sing, "OPEN TO US, LORD." A voice from behind the doors continues the conversation until the doors are opened wide an all enter with joy, feeling the Triumph that Jesus brings us—Life Eternal.

For the evening *Badarak*, fasting should begin after the midday meal and continue until the evening *Badarak* has been celebrated.



APRIL 24: A DUAL REMEMBRANCE AT ST. JOHN'S... WEDNESDAY, APRIL 24, 2013, 7:00 PM

St. John Armenian Church will commemorate the 98th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide on Wednesday, April 24th at 7:00 pm. A solemn Requiem Service will be offered in memory of the one and one half million Armenian souls who perished at the hands of the Ottoman Turkish Empire during 1915 and thereafter. We will also honor the survivors of the Genocide residing in the metro Detroit area. Following the requiem service, clergy, deacons, choristers and congregation will proceed outdoors for the *madagh* blessing and wreath-laying ceremony.

A much-awaited event that will take place this evening is the dedication of the new monument (artist's rendering pictured at right) on our grounds adja-

cent to the Martyrs Monument. This new monument will remember the countless innocent Armenians who perished in the forgotten Armenian Genocide – Pogroms in Azerbaijan that began 25 years ago in February 1988 in Kirovabad, and continued in Sumgait and Baku until 1990. After two years of fundraising and planning, the community of St. John Armenian Church proudly erects this monument so that Armenians and non-Armenians alike will come to know about this modern-day Genocide, with its proper recognition and place in history.



After the dedication service, the traditional *madagh* dinner in memory of our blessed martyrs will be served in the Cultural Hall. All are welcome to share in this complimentary memorial meal.



Noted author Chris Bohjalian (pictured at left) will speak at 8:00 pm. The grandson of Armenian survivors, Bohjalian will share his thoughts on this solemn occasion with reflections on **The Sandcastle Girls**, which was published in July 2012 to great acclaim. It is a love story set in the midst of the Armenian Genocide. It debuted at #7 on the New York Times best-seller list. USA Today called it "stirring ... a deeply moving story of survival and enduring love."

THE GREAT LENTEN SEASON

During the period of Great Lent in the Armenian Church we observe the following:

- The altar curtain is closed.
- There is no Kiss of Peace during the Divine Liturgy.
- Holy Communion is not offered during the Divine Liturgy.
- The Holy Gospels Book is not venerated after worship.
- Hymns are sung in penitential melody.
- Names of saints are not remembered.
- The organ is not played when departing from the sanctuary.
