## **TODAY'S GOSPEL: JOHN 3:13-21**

No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. # FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS-SOՆ Ս. ԽԱՉԻ ՎԵՐԱՑՈՒՄԻՆ THE SEASON OF THE CROSS

September and October feature special commemorations of the Holy Cross. Understandably, the Feasts of the Cross are important to Christians. The Cross is the place where God, who became human to share in and ultimately redeem human suffering and death, was crucified and died. It is also the place where He vanquished death through His resurrection, thereby rendering the cross a powerful symbol of eternal life...



- The crossbars intersect at a midpoint that signifies the four corners of the world meeting at life's center
- The "empty" Armenian cross (as opposed to the Roman Catholic tradition of the Lord's Body displayed on the Cross) emphasizes Jesus' victory over death
- The appearance of vines, grapes, and wheat as decorative motifs in the Armenian cross symbolizes life generating from the Cross which was formerly an instrument of death

Armenians are part of the Holy Cross' rescue and adoration. The Persians had seized the Cross when they conquered the city of Jerusalem. Leading a coalition of forces (including Armeni-

ans led by Mjej Gnuni), Emperor Heraclius recaptured the cross and in 629 passed through Armenia with it where it was repeatedly raised up and venerated.

The Armenian Church celebrates the Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross on the Sunday nearest to September 14. Following the Holy *Badarak*, the order of *ANTASDAN* takes place, when the four corners of the world are blessed as a symbol for all the world. During *Antasdan*, the processional cross is decorated with *rehan*, fresh sweet basil, because the Cross was discovered laying in a garden bed of sweet basil. It is then given out to the faithful.

#### **VENERATION OF THE RELIC OF THE HOLY CROSS**

We are blessed to have housed in our sanctuary a true relic of the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. At the conclusion of today's Blessing of the Four Corners / Antasdan, we invite you to come forward to kiss the relic encased in a silver reliquary and receive a portion of blessed basil.

# **News from the Diocese**

New Coordinator for the Diocesan Youth & Young Adult Ministries Department

My blessings and warm wishes to you all. This is a follow-up to the Diocese's announcement last spring regarding the creation of a new Department of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. In that message, we confirmed that Jennifer Morris would be serving as the departmental director, responsible for our national and regional ACYOA Seniors and Juniors programs, as well as for directing our Diocesan camp programs (St. Vartan Camp and Hye Camp). We also announced that given the scope of this position, we would be hiring a Youth and Young Adult Ministries Coordinator, to support Ms. Morris in managing the new department.

I am very happy to announce that the Coordinator position has been filled. Lori Odabashian joined the staff of the Department of Youth and Young Adult Ministries on September 4. In her new role Lori will work in partnership with Jennifer Morris, providing administrative and office support and coordinating youth and young adult programs throughout the Diocese.

I know you all will join us in welcoming Lori Odabashian to the Diocesan Youth and Young Adult Ministries staff. May our Lord continue to guide and strengthen our church in all its efforts to spread the gospel of Christ among our youth.

# NOTICE OF FIRE EMERGENCY EVACUATION PLAN FOR ST. JOHN'S CHURCH AND CHURCH SCHOOL

The Parish Council has undertaken the development of a **FIRE EMERGENCY AND EVACUATION PLAN** for St. John's Armenian Church and Church School. This will be the first step in a plan that will encompass several different types of emergencies (i.e. fire, tornado, lock-down). This fall, we will begin by teaching Church School students, teachers, ushers, choir and Parish Council members the procedures for safe evacuation of the church complex in the event of a fire emergency. We plan on having two "fire drills" involving the entire church and Church School on **October 27th and November 3rd.** This will take place at the end of the church service. Please make every effort to attend church and have your children in Church School so you can participate in this very important drill.

The following are guidelines for parishioners in case of a fire emergency:

**In the Sanctuary -** Parish Council members, ushers and choir members will be "leaders" trained to guide people safely out of the sanctuary to the big St. John sign and grassy area at the SE corner of the church during a fire emergency.

**In the Church School**—Teachers and Church School staff will guide students safely out of the building to the grassy area behind the church during a fire emergency.

Other "leaders" will canvas the building to make sure all are safely out of the building. Once it is determined that all is safe, an "ALL CLEAR" notice will be given by the pastor and everyone **must** return to the building to pick up their children and continue the rest of the day as usual.

Thank you for your participation and cooperation during these very important drills.
