

In accordance with Armenian Church Canon Law, all church members should receive the sacrament of Holy Communion on Easter. For persons in good health, it is necessary to fast, abstain from food and participate in the sacrament of Confession before receiving Holy Communion. For those of ill health who are on special medication, a light breakfast is permitted. For the evening *Badarak*, fasting should begin after the midday meal and continue until the evening *Badarak* has been celebrated.

It is the pious tradition in the Armenian Church to make a special offering to our parish home for the perpetuation of religious and educational programs as well as charitable deeds to be offered in the name of our Saviour. 

FROM FATHER GARABED'S DESK.....

There is a most compelling parable that Jesus tells in response to the Apostles when they asked for more faith. At first, the answer seems slightly baffling as Jesus says, "Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded?" Our Lord doesn't leave it there; he goes on and says, "So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, 'We are worthless slaves.'" Those words "ordered" and "worthless" have a different nuance when we really understand what Our Lord was getting at. His words were not harsh at all; rather they were for an everyday accounting of what discipleship and faith mean for us. They were a reminder of our servitude to Christ and serving others as well.

When we've done everything expected of us, a matter-of-fact response from us should be, 'The work is done. What we were told to do, we did, and, is there anything else to be done?" As a parish, a Christian community, and as faithful individuals in living out our faith, we should know in truth that <u>our work is really never done</u>. When we read the Gospel of our Lord and put all those lessons we learn from the life of Jesus 'into action' doing what we are called to do as he commands, then we become alive in Christ and are indeed Living *the Gospel of Christ*; we are living in ways however great and small that reveal Christ, God's Light of the World in our midst.

Think of it this way, if we weren't living out our faith in everyday moments, His light would be drained out of the world! We can't wait until the time when our lives are perfect and our ducks are all in a row to start *doing what we ought to have done* in everyday moments. Many people do exactly that; by putting off what should be done now, they miss some of the greatest opportunities and happiness in their lives. Because they are so consumed with the present, the real fulfilling, living experience of Christianity may never come to them. The greatest regret is NOT HAVING DONE what we could or should have done. Learning how to be Christ-like, and doing what we are called to do is not for later, but for NOW.

Simply put, for Christians, the Christian lifestyle is not one of waiting to do what is commanded, but one of starting now, for the sake of Jesus Christ and His love, by sharing Him with others and showing Him to others no matter who they are: believer or unbeliever. Serving Him is *Discipleship and Stewardship*. To be a Disciple and Steward is an honor, a gift from God, fulfilling one's call, so we can say, 'We have done only what we ought to have done!' I pray that the Lord and His Holy Spirit continues to guide us all to be and remain the *Living Gospel of Christ* for each other and to the world doing only what we all should do.'

Marriages

Arrangements for weddings are to be made at least eight months in advance. Marriage preparation and counseling are required before the celebration of the sacrament. The Bestman (*Khachyeghpayr*) must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Church. The parish office will make all necessary arrangements for the deacon, organist and soloist. Marriages are not celebrated during Great Lent.

Baptisms and Chrismations

All baptisms must be scheduled at least two months in advance. Pre-baptismal preparation for the parents and godparents is required. At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Faith.

Regulation of Sacramental Services

In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, all sacraments, e.g. funerals, weddings, baptisms and rites of Christian burial, can only be administered in the church sanctuary, which has been consecrated for the celebrations of these sacred rites.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

We are pleased to announce that our Parish will be visited by a Seminarian, Levon Asdourian from mid-July until approximately the end of August 2014.

Levon is a first year graduate student at St. Nersess Armenian Seminary. He was born in Philadelphia and grew up at Sts. Sahag and Mesrob Armenian Church (Wynnewood, PA.) Levon received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the State University of New York at Purchase. He is enrolled in the joint Master of Divinity program at St. Nersess and St. Vladimir's Seminaries.

Levon grew up in an Armenian-speaking household and is fluent in Armenian. Before beginning at St. Nersess, he served in the United States Marine Corps and is a certified trainer. Levon trained the Youth Marine Corps physical fitness team for 10 years at his local high school in Philadelphia.

While he is with us Levon will be working closely with Der Garabed to better understand the daily responsibilities of a Parish Priest. In addition, Deacon Rubik will offer musical instruction. As our community is well known for our wonderful hospitality, we will schedule a reception when Levon arrives so that we can all welcome him to Michigan.

In the interim, the Parish Council is inquiring if you are interested in providing lodging and hosting Levon in your home during his stay, (about 6 weeks), providing a vehicle for his use, or contributing financially to help make his visit more meaningful. ACYOA JUNIORS RETREAT NEWS.....



The first of eight planned ACYOA Juniors retreats took place at St. John Armenian Church on the weekend of February 8-9. Participants included young people from St. John Church and St. Gregory of Narek Church of Richmond Heights, OH.

The retreat focused on the Diocesan theme "Living the Gospel of Christ." Presentations were made by the Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian, pastor of St. John Church; the Rev. Fr. Hratch Sargsyan, pastor of St. Gregory of Narek Church; and Jennifer Morris, the Diocese's director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries.

On Sunday, Fr. Sargsyan was the guest celebrant at St. John Church. Following the Divine Liturgy, the ACYOA Juniors hosted a presentation on the Diocesan summer camp programs and celebrated the 50th anniversary of Hye Camp.

Despite a Sunday morning snow storm on February 9th, a yearly tradition took place after celebrating the Divine Liturgy when Fr. Garabed invited parents with infants to come forward so their children could receive a special blessing.

Significant to remember, Jesus was presented to the Jerusalem Temple by his parents for a special blessing by the high priest, Saint Simeon.

This Judaic tradition of presenting the firstborn to the temple and dedicating the child to God has been adopted by the Armenian Church as a day on which newly born or newly baptized infants are blessed by the priest.

Impressed by the number of infants that have received this yearly blessing, this event has become a regular celebration of our parish. - Harry Avagian - On Tuesday, February 11, the Tuesday Lunch Club had the pleasure of a presentation from Eric Crisenbery on "Sleep and Aging." The fourteen attendees were made aware that there are two types of sleep: non-rapid eye movement and rapid eye movement. It was interesting to learn that we cycle through these two types of sleep approximately every 90 minutes. Older adults require seven to nine hours of sleep every night. Many of us have trouble falling to sleep at night, waking up many times each night, waking up early and unable to fall back to sleep, waking up and feeling tired, which are all symptoms of insomnia. Small lifestyle changes can help you sleep at night. You should also notify your doctor if you have these symptoms and he may be able to provide a solution to your problem.

Eric's next presentation will be in March. We hope to see you then and afterwords you can join us for lunch. Remember, a good night's rest will keep you healthy, wealthy and wise. - Daniel Cristiano -

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
