Through December, 2010, PAWS® has trained and certified more than 2,300 Assistance Dog teams.

Our tour guide was very knowledgeable and spent three hours with the group. Although the tour was to be presented as an architectural tour, the majority concerned the Masonic history. Much of the information was interesting, especially when it came to famous people such as President Truman, Henry Ford and Bunkie Knudsen.

The group did get to see three of the Masonic active lodge rooms which are very ornate. The group also saw the Knights Templar Hall where currently weddings take place. Interesting facts about the building include: the temple design was based on Solomon's Temple; there are 17 floors above ground and four below; the present building is the 3rd temple built at its current location; it is the largest Masonic Temple in the world; and the exact center of the building is located in the Knights Templar Hall in the cross hanging from the ceiling. The building has more than a thousand rooms, an Olympic size swimming pool, two theaters and hundreds of locker rooms to house the various uniforms of the Masons.

The Men's Society would like to thank John Kalajian for setting up this tour and hope that we can do it again with more emphasis on the architectural aspects of the building, which were not under his control. John would like to line up another tour with a different tour guide. Some of the group followed the tour with a lunch at the Traffic Jam Restaurant in Detroit and were treated to a tour of the facilities including a rooftop garden.

The Arts of Armenia Program sponsored by the Komitas Choir combined with the Summer Day Camp Program led by Lisa Mardigian resulted in the largest turnout of children in four years of its existence. Twenty-seven children participated with six counselors assisting the two teachers from Armenia. Children are lovingly cared for by their parents. So what is the role of the godparent? **Godparents** are charged with the **spiritual** care of the child.

In Greek (the language of the New Testament) baptism meant "to dip," which originally referred to dipping cloth in a pool of dye over and over until the color was right and ready to set. How appropriate a word it is for starting a new life as a new person of a new faith!

John the Baptist told of the coming of Jesus, who would "baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). He baptized Jesus Himself, an extraordinary event that became the model for Christian initiation. People learning the new faith sought a "sponsor," a knowledgeable Christian to instruct, guide and pray with them. This was the start of the idea of a "godparent." It evolved into a lifetime relationship. Baptism was just the beginning...

Marriages

Arrangements for weddings are to be made at least eight months in advance. Marriage preparation and counseling are required before the celebration of the sacrament. The Bestman (Khachyeghpayr) must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Church. The parish office will make all necessary arrangements for the deacon, organist and soloist. Marriages are not celebrated during Great Lent.

Baptisms and Chrismations

All baptisms must be scheduled at least two months in advance. Pre-baptismal preparation for the parents and godparents is required. At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Faith.

Regulation of Sacramental Services

In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, all sacraments, e.g. funerals, weddings, baptisms and rites of Christian burial, can only be administered in the church sanctuary, which has been consecrated for the celebrations of these sacred rites.

Everyone should know that our Komitas Choir is not only present on Sunday mornings to participate in the celebration of the Divine Liturgy, but also is engaged in educational and recreational and church-related programs and activities.

One such activity took place during mid-July. Known as the Arts of Armenia, this program consisted of summer workshops for children and adults during which two talented professional educators from Armenia, Ella Pepanyan and Arman Julhakyan, provided instruction in the arts and traditional dances of Armenia. Their efforts
