#### St. John's Builds Fourth House in Armenia





lay cement on the floor for four rooms. We worked for two days and traveled Armenia on the third day. On our free days we visited Holy Etchmiadzin Cathedral that echoed with the sounds of bells and beautiful voices of the clergy and choir. On the way to Khor Virab we saw Mt. Ararat standing majestically on the horizon. This mountain symbolizes the spirit and survival of every Armenian. Khor Virab Monastery is the site where St. Gregory the Illuminator was imprisoned for preaching Christianity. Many climbed down the pit where St. Gregory lived for thirteen years. On to Garni, the pagan temple and of course Geghart, the church which was carved out of solid rock. We went to the Areni Wine Factory, the Sardarbad Memorial, the Matenadaran, and Tatev Vank that was built in the 9th century on top of a mountain. The visit to Tsitsernakaberd Monument was emotionally moving. We laid flowers and said a prayer at the eternal flame.

After ten days our job of helping to build a home for the Khachatryan family was completed and we headed back to Yerevan with a stop at Lake Sevan. As a result of new roads Lake Sevan is just a fifty-minute drive from Yerevan.

On July  $4^{\text{th}}$  the group headed for the airport. We had worked and contributed to the building of a home, working in Armenia side by side with our Armenian brothers and sisters. We all had tears in our eyes and a reluctant departure for home; our fantastic experience had come to an end. We all recognized the importance of a culturally vibrant and successful Armenia. We were instilled with a sense of pride and a desire to return to Armenia again and again. Armenia is ours and such will remain!

Dear parishioners of St. John Armenian Church School,

We are writing to express our deepest gratitude to all members of St. John Armenian Church School for the donation you have made. Your continuous contribution is very important for Armenian families in need of housing. Your donation covered the sponsorship of the house of the Khachatryan family from Shatin village, Vayots Dzor region. We are also grateful to Global Builders team from Detroit led by Jackie ElChemmas, who came and worked side by side with the Khachatryans from June 19 – July 3.

Fuller Center for Housing Armenia (FCHA) was registered in Spring 2008 and as of July 2010, 113 families were served, and 14 houses are under construction.

The Khachatryan family consists of Grandfather Denik Khachatryan, 70; Grandmother Nushik Manukyan, 69; Father Arman Khachatryan, 33; Mother Aida Babayan, 28; Daughter Serine Babayan, 10; Son Sevak Khachatryan, 8.

The Khachatryan family lived in the old district of Shatin village, where all the houses were under danger of demolition. The houses of this district should have been demolished even in the 1980s, but the collapse of the Soviet Union as well as the blockade of Armenia left them without any attention from the government for many years. Finally, the Armenian government provided funds to the families from that district to build houses, but the funds were only enough for constructing a half-built house. The family was hoping to finish construction of their home in the near future. The family's main income is from cattle-breeding. The father, Arman, was also working as a guard, but the income was never enough to finish the house and take care of the family at the same time. Now the construction of the Khachatryan's house is progressing, and they plan to complete construction and move in before the winter. All the family, together with friends and local community, has joined their efforts to achieve this goal! The volunteer team of eleven from St. John's worked side by side with the family. We will send more updates with photos and family information upon completion of the house. Once again, we thank you for your good will and generosity.



#### Marriages

Arrangements for weddings are to be made at least eight months in advance. Marriage preparation and counseling are required before the celebration of the sacrament. The Bestman (Khachyeghpayr) must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Church. The parish office will make all necessary arrangements for the deacon, organist and soloist. Marriages are not celebrated during Great Lent.

#### **Baptisms and Chrismations**

All baptisms must be scheduled at least two months in advance. Pre-baptismal preparation for the parents and godparents is required. At least one of the godparents must be a member of the Armenian Orthodox Faith.

#### Regulation of Sacramental Services

In accordance with Diocesan discipline mandated by the Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, all sacraments, e.g. funerals, weddings, baptisms and rites of Christian burial, can only be administered in the church sanctuary, which has been consecrated for the celebrations of these sacred rites.
