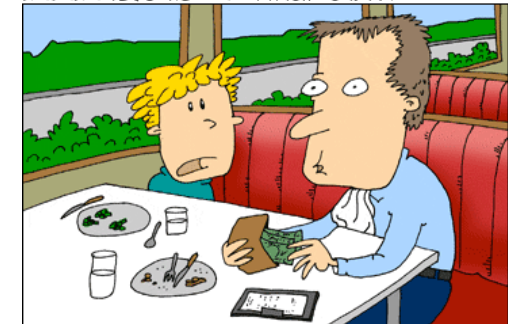

A while later she heard loud

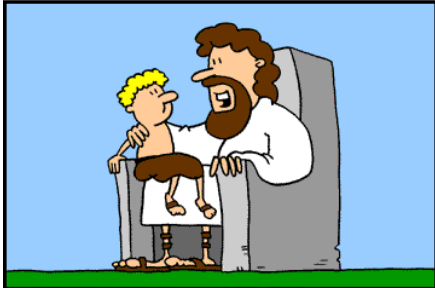


meowing and hissing and ran back to the open window to see Johnny baptizing the cat in a tub of water.

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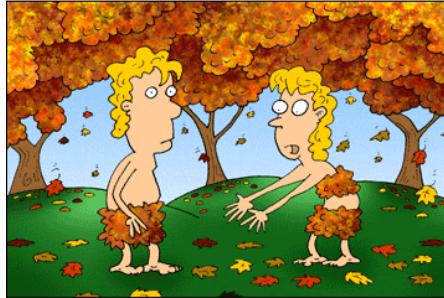
